(ST. JOHN'S, NL, Canada) - Preparations are ramping up for the WAS North America & Aquaculture Canada 2022 conference and trade show - the first joint World Aquaculture Society (WAS), Aquaculture Association of Canada (AAC) and NL Aquaculture Industry Association (NAIA) meeting, and the largest conference and trade show in over 20 years in Canada on the science, business and technology of aquaculture.

This meeting will be held in St. John's, NL, Canada from August 15 - 18, 2022, and the theme of the conference is Aquaculture: The Leading Edge of Food Production.

"This meeting will celebrate the progress and cutting-edge innovations that have led to the successes of the industry to date and that will propel it into the future – but also recognize the important challenges faced in many areas," said John Cooksey, WAS Conference Manager.
