

Mowi Canada East Public Notice:

Statement Regarding Confirmed ISAv Detection

August 31, 2022 – Newfoundland and Labrador

Mowi Canada East advises that there has been a confirmed detection of pathogenic Infectious Salmon Anaemia virus (ISAv) in Atlantic salmon at its Little Burdock Cove marine site (AQ#1083). This detection of ISAv was identified through the Provincial Government Department of Fisheries, Forestry, and Agriculture's (FFA) species-specific aquatic animal health surveillance program.

This confirmation follows the <u>public notice of suspect detection issued on July 30, 2022.</u>

The two cages affected contain a total of 46,003 fish at an average weight of 2.7kgs.

The company will harvest the salmon from the affected cages. This proactive approach of removing fish following a detection has proven to be the most successful method for managing this virus. The company is taking all responsible steps under the oversight of the Newfoundland and Labrador Department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture, and is following government approved policies.

ISAv is a naturally occurring virus and not a human health issue or food safety issue. This public notice complies with FFA's policy AP 17.
